Grants to help defray travel and lodging costs are made to scholars of any academic discipline who are engaged in projects that relate to the study of Catholics in America and stand to benefit from use of collections at the Hesburgh Libraries and the University Archives.

The Archives collects and maintains records, papers, photographs, printed material, and audio-visual material documenting the life of the Catholic Church and its people in the American context. Major subject areas include Catholic press and publishing, higher education, social action, laity, clergy, religious orders, charismatic renewal, and the liturgical movement. 1. completed application form;
2. current *curriculum vitae*;
3. project description (up to 1,000 words) specifying the pertinence of Notre Dame resources;
4. proposed budget estimating travel, lodging, and research expenses.

Recommendations are no longer required for Research Travel Grant applications.

All materials must be submitted by **December 31, 2017**. Applicants will be notified by March.
